

FACT: Issue 21 is cost effective, good for education and important to our community.

FACT: Our school buildings are aging, inefficient and cause educational and financial problems.

FACT: Leaking roofs, failing plumbing, and insufficient electrical capacity detract from instruction time and drain dollars from education.

FACT: The State of Ohio reviewed our buildings, concluding they are no longer suited for today's education and it is more fiscally responsible to build new a new school rather than make repairs.

FACT: Issue 21 builds a new school for grades 6-12 with age appropriate wings. Our elementary students will move to our middle school building and we'll remove our aging and inefficient elementary buildings from service.

FACT: Issue 21 will provide our students and teachers with the right environment for today's education.
